MINUTES OF A SPECIAL MEETING OF THE DUNCHURCH PARISH COUNCIL AND THE CHAIRMAN, VICE CHAIRMAN, Cllrs. BIRCH AND WILLIS OF THE ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH AND CONTROL COMMITTEE OF THE RUGBY BOROUGH COUNCIL TOGETHER WITH THEIR OFFICERS HELD AT THE W.I. HALL SOUTHAM ROAD ON WEDNESDAY 24TH JULY 1974.

1) APOLOGY FOR ABSENCE

Cllr. H.J. Wiggins apologised for not being present. All other Councillors attended.

2) PROVISION OF PUBLIC TOILETS

The Chairman of the Environmental Health and Control Committee (Mrs. P. Hill) asked for the Parish Council's up to date views on what was now required. She said times have changed and were the toilets still considered necessary, if so did the Parish Council wish to make provision for them themselves as they were now authorised to do, or did they wish the Borough Council to continue.

agreed The Council Chairman (Cllr. J.E.F. Barford) replied that the Council was unanimous that the scheme should go ahead, and because they had no trained staff to do the work it would be best for the Borough Council to carry out the works. He said that the Midland Bank site had been agreed mainly because the Rugby Rural District Council had not been able to offer a better site. Cllr. Barford outlined the history of the matter since 1969, and said that there was a considerable feeling that land forming part of the Dun Cow provided the best site if the owners would be willing to sell.

The meeting then adjourned whilst the sites were inspected.

Upon return it was proposed by Cllr. S.J. Watts, seconded by Cllr. Mrs. J.E. Coling that the Borough Council be requested to provide toilet facilities in Dunchurch as soon as possible. The most suitable site is considered to be part of the Car Park at the Dun Cow Hotel, and that negotiations be opened with the owners to acquire the necessary land. In the event of this site being unobtainable the matter be referred back to the Parish Council for further consideration.
