Coronation Chairs

There was a tenuous but important link to Dunchurch at the King's Coronation. Neil of NEJ Stevenson lives in Dunchurch and this is the story behind those fabulous blue chairs that were at the front of the congregation at Westminster Abbey.

here is a rich tradition of
Coronation chairs being used by
the great and the good of society
during the ceremonies. In the main these
chairs were of simple design as they
were only intended to be used once
and for a relatively short period of time.
During the 20th century the guests were
invited to buy the chair they had used as
a way to recoup some funds.

As the cabinetmakers to Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II, we were approached to design and manufacture one hundred chairs to carry on the tradition and

we were delighted to be asked. Unfortunately, time was not on our side as it was not until mid-February that we received the go ahead to manufacture, giving us and the Royal Household upholsterers only eleven weeks to complete. The design was deliberately simple in form to aid production, utilising a square seat frame and simple tapered legs.

To give the upholsterers a head start we manufactured the seat frames first so that the preliminary upholstery work could be started. The first batch of chair frames was delivered to Windsor on the 21st March with subsequent deliveries over the next two weeks. This was an amazing achievement from the staff who exceeded all expectations in giving the upholsterers as much time as possible to complete the work with a week to spare.



The chair frames are made from English oak and finished with a hard oil applied by hand. The fabric is blue velvet with embroidered cyphers. The seats are webbed on a plywood frame with foam padding providing a comfortable place from which to watch the Coronation.

Dunchurch Allotments

n early July I visited the Homestead View Community Design Event in the village to ascertain to what extent the planned developments in the area would impact on the allotments. Homestead View is the name given to the large housing and infrastructure development planned for SW Rugby and is bordered by Dunchurch, Bilton, Cawston and the A4071.

I was pleased to see there is a plan for green open space between the allotment eastern boundary hedge and the new spine road. This will be accessible to residents with grassland, footpaths, trees and possibly open water. This will mean the

housing development will not run up to the allotment boundary. I was also pleased to see the magnificent oak tree which currently sits in the middle of this field will be retained, with the new spine road passing to the east.

The public footpath which currently runs west to east towards the large oak is likely to be rerouted and follow the boundary hedge southwards to Coventry Road.

The biggest change affecting allotment holders is the re-routing of traffic out of Dunchurch onto the new spine road. Vehicles will no longer be able to drive along the Coventry Road from Dun-

church heading to the A45 in a straight line but will be required to follow the road which will bear right near The Elms and join the spine

installed for vehicles turning into Windmill Lane.

The SW Rugby Masterplan Supplementary Planning Document adopted in 2021 indicates that 6.22 hectares should be allocated to new allotments. There are currently no plans for their location and the concern is that

the allotment allocation will be divided up into small pieces of land and dotted around the whole area. While this has its benefits in terms of proximity to homes it is unlikely to create a strong allotment community and the support required for their development.

road a few hundred yards further on. The spine road will rejoin Coventry Road by the eastern allotment gate.

I expressed my concern to a representative of Homes England (who are managing the development of Homestead View) about access to the

gate considering the likely increase in traffic. A possible adaption suggested could be the installation of a central reservation area for vehicles turning right into the allotment site. This would be similar to the one currently

he Our Jay Foundation confirms that further funding has been found to add to our own donation of £1,200. The combined funds will be used to install three accessible defibrillators in the village. The first



is already fitted and operational at Dunchurch Baptist Church and will be followed by others at Dunchurch Garage and the Junior School.

The story behind the founding of the Our Jay Foundation is a sad one, the pain of which every parent could relate to. However, the subsequent story is inspirational and highlights the power of a mother's love for her child and the strength of human spirit. Since 18-year-old Jay's death from a cardiac arrest in the early hours of New Year's Day 2022, the Foundation, supported by family and friends, has fitted an amazing 65 accessible defibrillators in and around the Rugby area with another ten waiting to be fitted. A further ten portable defibrillators have also been purchased.

Further damage was caused to the cricket nets and heavy roller incurring losses of £400 for the cricket club. Following a clean-up operation by 15 volunteers, (we are most grateful to them for their help), rubbish was removed by RBC at a further cost of £150.

he decline in coaching began when the railways were built, but of course the introduction of the 'horseless carriage' made a greater impact and hastened the decline of the coaching days and with it, the trade of the inns. The railways were not welcomed in the rural communities. These smoke-belching monsters would poison the air and frighten the cattle, they said. Besides they would take away their trade. Thus, as in so many places, the railway line was kept as far away as could be and Dunchurch station is guite some distance from the village. The line from Rugby to Leamington opened in 1851.

The following is from *The Coventry Mercury*, April 10th 1897: Motor Carriages at Dunchurch.

'Officials of Humber & Co. arranged for an excursion when approximately 50 horseless carriages and tricycles set off from the King's Hotel, Coventry at 2.30pm to rendezvous at Dunchurch. The people of Dunchurch were on the look-out and about a quarter to four the approach of the first 'motor' was announced by some lads who had a view of a good stretch of the old London Road. It was a tricycle of the 'Dion' pattern, driven by Mr. Roebuck. Five minutes later Mr. Webb came sailing in on a Bollee tricycle and in turning sharply into the yard at the Dun Cow, narrowly escaped running over a dog, which had failed to gauge the speed at which the new machines travelled. The other vehicles which followed included a yellow Panhard Wagonette, a hooded Phaeton, Phaeton with pneumatic tyres, commercial 'bus with six passengers and other vehicles propelled by petroleum, together with eight or ten ordinary Broughams, containing the remainder of the Humber officials and friends.

'Between four and five pm, motor carriages and cycles were running in all directions, giving the onlookers an idea of what the various conveyances were capable of doing. Some were treated to a short ride and



expressed themselves surprised at the ease and comfort with which the carriages moved.

'Horses do not take to the vehicles kindly and there were incidences during the afternoon when they could not be induced to face the motors and one accident happened which might have been attended with serious consequences. After sporting for about an hour or more, the excursionists and carriages were photographed in front of the Dun Cow. This was followed by a sumptuous repast and an enjoyable smoking concert at the Dun Cow Hotel'.

A Parish Council minute from 1908 expressed concern at the speed of motor cars passing through the village and at the dust nuisance this caused. They sought a bye-law to reduce the speed to 8mph.

Could anyone have foreseen that with the advent of the petrol engine, these once-busy coaching routes would once again carry some of the largest volumes of traffic in the Midlands? The inn with its Crown,
Mother Red Cap so sly,
The Lion so rampant and red,
The sporting 'Green Man',
with his gun shouldered high,
The monstrous Dun Cow,
that was killed by great Guy,
And the Bell, whose last sound is now dead.

I remember the notes of the guard's merry horn
(Ere the iron road stretched through the land)
With sounds of 'bright chanticleer' hailing the morn,
And loud on the echoes 'tantivy' was borne As the coach roll'd along through the sand.

Two verses from 'Village Memories', Dunchurch, Warwickshire, by John Whiteman. Born in Dunchurch, he left for Australia in 1850, settling in Emerald Hill with his business in Melbourne. The poem is taken from his book 'Sparks and Sounds from a Colonial Anvil'.



Doctors in Dunchurch, Part 19: Vaccination

ecember 8th 2020. A milestone.
The world's first ever Covid-19
vaccine was given in Coventry. The
product of intense work by world-class

scientists and a glimmer of light after nine months of fatalities, near fatalities, fear, anxiety, lockdowns, and toilet roll shortages!

Ten days later the vaccine arrived in Rugby, but with high global demand, only restricted quantities were available. The vaccine had to be stored at minus 70 degrees Celsius and there were strict protocols for preparation and administration of the vaccine The vaccination area had to be ventilated through open doors and windows which proved a challenge in late December. The local solution was a dedicated vaccination centre at Locke House near the railway station in Rugby shared by all the Rugby practices over nine months. The doctors and

nurses from each surgery took turns to vaccinate their patients at the centre, initially supported by our own staff, then later by the many wonderful volunteers

> from the area, people of all ages and from all walks of life who stood for hours and helped process the patients for vaccination for months on end.

In December 2020 we started to vaccinate our oldest patients

who were most vulnerable to the disease. The first Dunchurch session was carried out in freezing cold (ventilated) conditions with staff and nonagenarian patients wearing overcoats and scarves. Everyone was stoic, good natured

and grateful. Blitz mentality!

This was not the end of the pandemic, but perhaps the beginning of the end?

Our practice nurses at Locke House. Gold dust! Now prepare it and protect those patients!


Road Building in Dunchurch

ollowing on from the article in our last magazine, below is an abbreviated excerpt from the Daily Telegraph and Morning Post of Friday, October 30th, 1959, when apparently, the building of the M45 was comparable to the road building feat of the Romans and the engineering capabilities of Robert Stephenson. Praise indeed!

Opening of New Motorway

Completion of Huge Task – Heavy Traffic on First Day – Scenes at Crick and Thurlaston

At 9.56am on Monday, traffic moved on to the M45 from the traffic roundabout between Dunchurch and the Blue Boar in the parish of Thurlaston. The same thing happened at the end of the M1 between Crick and the Halfway House. Thus was inaugurated, as far as this



district was concerned, the greatest feat of roadmaking since the Romans laid the skeleton of the map of England. The motorway's construction is comparable with Robert Stephenson's building of the London – Birmingham railway in the 1930's.
