Welcome

he landscape surrounding our village is undergoing dramatic change and the new warehouses on the perimeter are now visible from several of the village approach roads. With still yet more to come, the building of 5000 new homes and a new relief road, the village footprint will be changed forever.

One could muse on what the Duke of Buccleuch would make of it all. For it was he, at the rise of the steam train. who refused to give access to his land which would have permitted the railroad to run right through the centre of the then market town of Dunchurch. Instead,

Rugby Junction was formed and Rugby town grew, dwarfing Dunchurch where eventually, a small local station was sited a mile from the village on the Coventry Road. The station closed to passengers on 15 June 1959 and closed to freight on 2 November 1964

Despite the fields around us shrinking and the popula-

tion growing, it is to their credit that the many organisations in Dunchurch continue to thrive and work hard to keep a village community spirit alive and next year will be no different. As well as all of our usual village events, Dunchurch has been invited by Bruno Peek, Pageantmaster, to take part in the 80-year commemorations of the D-Day Landings, and meetings will shortly begin to discuss how best we can mark this important event. We will bring you more information in our next issue in March but for now, your village magazine publishing team wish you all a very happy Christmas and a New Year filled with love, peace and joy.




Dunchurch Allotments

hat is a group of owls called?
How far can squirrels jump?
What can't frogs do when
eating?

These were just some of the questions that families were asked as they explored Dunchurch Allotments 'Wildlife Wander' in August this year. Painted plaques of animals created by allotment holders were displayed around the plots, the creatures ranged from mammals and birds, amphibians and reptiles to a selection of insects and an arachnid. Next to each picture was information about the creature which would help the Wildlife Wanderers with the answer to questions posed.

On arriving back at base, a selection of refreshments was on offer with the cakes inspired by allotment produce, including classic carrot cake, delectable courgette loaf and irresistible beetroot and chocolate cake. For the more discerning kids



While celebrating and enjoying the creatures that gardeners live alongside on the allotments, we also have a love-hate relationship with some of them. The beasties that nibble our young seedlings like snails and caterpillars are a regular topic of conversation on the plots. The blackbirds that love to strip our cherry trees of the unripe fruit makes us fume at being too slow to get the netting up.



Wood pigeons descend from the sky onto newly germinated peas and brassica shoots leaving tiny stalks with tattered leaves. The destruction can come from underground as well. In some years mole hills dot the allotment landscape as these furry creatures tunnel the worm rich soil and disturb our plants, and mice with the occasional rat love to feast on newly sown beans or scurrying up the maize stalks for a bountiful blow-out on sweetcorn kernels.

Gardeners have to learn how to avoid the worst ravages of crop attack without

resorting to the wholesales use of poisonous chemicals and tolerate a certain amount of crop destruction.

In a recent discussion with a wildlife caring allotment holder, I was told that they had in the past resorted to live trapping a rat on their plot which they took to the far side of Warwickshire to release only to find out later that this was against the law. Vermin such as the black rat (Rattus rattus) and grey squirrel (Sciurus carolinensis) should not be moved to other areas but humanely killed.

The allotment site continues to be a haven for wildlife as numerous bird and bat boxes have been installed and a number of allotment holders have put in ponds which team with tadpoles in the spring. Nocturnal creatures like hedgehogs and

foxes are occasionally seen and evidence has shown we are visited by badgers and muntjac deer – and this year for the first time red kites have been seen circling above the allotments.


